**OBSERVATIONS/REBUTTALS** are beginning. Yes, we will absolutely be sending out surveys later on in the cycle to see how the modified framework is being implemented. HOWEVER...for EVERY POINT YOU DISAGREE with or needs clarity you HAVE to write a rebuttal. You must also note ANY and ALL attendance of students, technical difficulties, compliance issues, etc. HERE is a link to our <u>REBUTTAL GUIDANCE</u>. Remember, for observations, rebuttals go to your ADMIN via email and to your clerk to be placed in your file in school as well.

**MANDATES**— If you cannot complete a task DURING the work day, you have to submit a <u>RSVP</u> <u>TO MANDATES</u> form. If you are being forced to finish work OUTSIDE of your work day, submit time sheets!
