Brothers and Sisters,

You know the saying, "it's always darkest before the dawn"? Well, our country is all up in that darkness right now. With vaccination approval for children under 12 coming this Fall, the dawn is just around the corner. But we're not there yet so we have to keep doing what we've been doing for a little while longer. Some hard data to brighten your day comes from the Office of Health Services; 81% of teachers are vaxed, 86% of CST and 65% of non-instructional. As a district we are beating, county, state & national averages. So for many of you, the safest place is your location as long as people don't start freaking out.

Attached is a two-sided Decision Tree being shared by the CDC to school districts across the country that should put your mind at ease. Using it only works if you understand the CDC's definition of "close contact" I'm

sharing here:

Close Contact through <u>Proximity and Duration of Exposure</u>: Someone who was within <u>6 feet of an infected person</u> (laboratory-confirmed or a <u>clinically compatible illness</u>) for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period (for example, three individual 5-minute exposures for a total of 15 minutes). An infected person can spread SARS-CoV-2 starting from 2 days before they have any symptoms (or, for asymptomatic patients, 2 days before the positive specimen collection date), until they meet criteria for <u>discontinuing home isolation</u>.

Exception: In the K–12 indoor classroom setting, the close contact definition excludes students who were within 3 to 6 feet of an infected student (laboratory-confirmed or a <u>clinically compatible illness</u>) if both the infected student and the exposed student(s) <u>correctly and consistently</u> wore well-fitting <u>masks</u> the entire time.

Lastly, on-site testing for staff & students is coming, albeit slowly due to coordination difficulties outside of the district's control. It would be nice and professional if your employer would do a better job in communicating these things to you, but with staff shortages, nationwide bus driver shortages and other assorted challenges facing our nation and the district, now is not the time to bite the hand that feeds us. So I beg each and every one of you: stay vigilant: get tested, check those temps, open those windows, put up them masks, and mind your distance, I'd rather have you monitoring the door then some stranger. Step in when able to lend a hand, there will be plenty of time for getting coverage and comp time later. The Dawn is just up ahead; let's see it together one day soon.

To minimize the impact on employees' paychecks at the start of the year, the district is going to advance you 4 days pay from later pay periods to pay you for the first week of school.

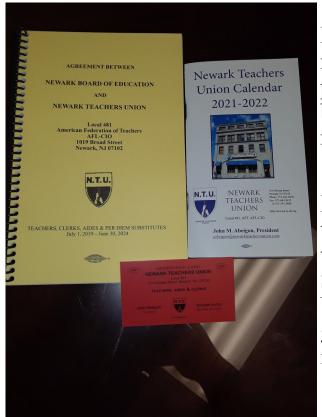

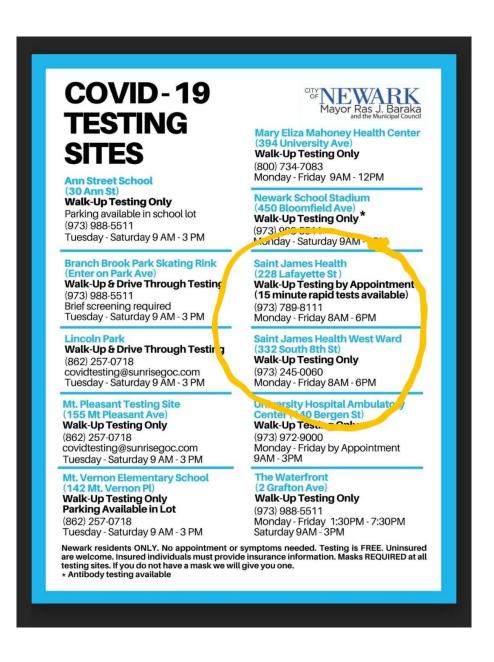
