help you schedule when and how you will vote this year.

October 23 – October 31: In-Person Early Voting Period.

October 26:

Deadline to apply for a Vote-by-Mail Ballot by Mail for General Election.

November 1 at 3pm:

Deadline to apply for a Vote by Mail ballot in person at your County Clerk's office.

November 2:

Election Day - Polls are open from 6:00am-8:00pm.

The reasons why you vote are personal, be it women's reproductive rights, childcare and education, COVID, gun control, decriminalization of weed, whichever issues are important to you. The important thing is that you vote. How you vote, when and where you vote is totally up to you (at least it still is in New Jersey). From the Desk of the Secretary Treasurer

The Power of an Email.

Most of the administrators in the district have been taught to avoid putting stuff in writing. Disagree? How many times have you sent an email to your admin asking a simple question only to have a response like..."see me."? Why? Because they want to avoid putting things in writing. The written word is powerful; as educators, we know this. It's in the clarity of our instructions and in the feedback we give our students, it's in the rules on our walls, and in the learning intentions we write. Do not let your administrators off the hook! Follow these simple guidelines.

When your admin stops you in the hall and asks you to do something, as soon as you can, get to your computer and send

them an email detailing what they just told you and ask if that is correct.

When you have a meeting with your admin, as soon as you can, send them an email summarizing it in detail and asking them to confirm it.

When they give you some task to do and you are pretty sure it's "extra-contractual," send that email, get them to confirm.

Every conversation requires an email to document, clarify and confirm. If they are not willing to reply to your confirmation, then it is "unclear, and unconfirmed" and you didn't want to act on it unless it was clear and confirmed.

Let your admins know this is how you and your school are operating and you will be amazed at how little they find for you to do that is "just a quick little favor."

Lastly, ALWAY PUT REQUESTS IN YOUR JOURNAL! Bring that journal to these impromptu meetings, let them know you keep accurate records. Much like when they walk into YOUR room with their clipboards scribbling away...you do the same...yes, it has the same effect!

Compliance, Class Size, and Compassion

When we sent out our compliance survey, we asked staff to report any class size problems as well. 43% of the surveys we received said their class size was over the state limit. In fact, we had 19 schools where over 50% of the responses reported class size over the limits. This would be egregious even without COVID!

This problem is compounded by the ongoing teacher shortage and a severe lack of subs. We have teachers who are covering classes pretty much every day, teachers working outside of their certifications, and staff going above and beyond every day to try and keep these schools functioning.



So of course, in all these schools, we have administrators who are giving these staff the proper support and appreciation they deserve...right? Of course not. 92.6% of the survey responses told us their admins were acting like everything was business as usual. Only 34% told us "My school is encouraging us to create lessons that are low-stress, engaging and focused on Social-Emotional learning."

So what can we do?

First off, if you miss a prep, for whatever reason, REPORT IT!

Second, when they pile mandates on you, put your hand up and remind them that there are only so many hours in the day. Ask "What is really important here?" And make sure you follow the NTU RSVP to Mandate procedures. We won an Arbitration Award on this very issue.

Third, work with your Building Rep and the Building Committee to find solutions. Saying No is important, but having an alternative is always better.

And when these issues can't be resolved, LET US KNOW! We can't resolve a problem that we don't know exists. Too often, we hear about these situations at the end of the school year when it's too late to do anything about them.
