
How to say no...politely!


REBUTTALS! REBUTTALS! REBUTTALS!

This is one of the most important documents for everyone that gets observed. It is a guide to writing a rebuttal and how to file it. You should look at it now, and get an idea of what you will need to do should you wish to write a rebuttal.

On another note...KNOW YOUR FRAMEWORK...one of the tricks I use to make sure I do well on observations is to write my plans and activities with the framework open. HOWEVER...in certain lessons, I don't

focus on HIGHLY EFFECTIVE, and sometimes I don't focus on EFFECTIVE...I focus on picking up the MOST points in the EASIEST areas first...and then if I can pick up a few points in the other areas, I still wind up effective.

Do your best to work smart and not hard. Know your admin!


