Heading into the last month of school, we have several major projects going on:

IMPORTANT REMINDER! This year marks the 10th anniversary of the changes Governor Christie enacted to NJ's tenure system, which became the <u>Teacher Effectiveness and Accountability for the Children of New Jersey (TEACHNJ) Act.</u>

I have been in contact with State Senator M. Teresa Ruiz, who <u>introduced the legislation in 2011</u>, about meeting to reevaluate TEACHNJ so it reflects the new norm in New Jersey while mapping out a vision for the future.

To make the most of this opportunity, we created an in-depth survey for educators to fill out about TEACHNJ. <u>The deadline is June 1!</u> We want to get as many different perspectives as possible here. TEACHNJ dictates everything from tenure to how staff are evaluated, so it's important for Newark staff voices to be heard!

Garden State Health Plan FAQ's

What is the Garden State Health Plan?

When the state created Chapter 44 to reduce staff contributions for benefits, the law required the state (and districts not participating in the School Employees Health Plan) to create two plans. The first plan is the New Jersey Educators Plan which has been available to us since January 2021. The second plan is the Garden State Health Plan. The Garden State Health Plan is half the cost of the New Jersey Educators Plan but **ONLY COVERS DOCTORS IN NJ!**

Am I required to move to the Garden State Health Plan?

All active staff hired before July 1, 2020 can remain on any of the health plans offered by the Newark Board of Education.

Eligible retirees and staff hired ON OR AFTER July 1, 2020 will be required to choose between the NJ Educator Health Plan or the Garden State Health Plan.

How much does the Garden State Health Plan cost?

Percentages listed are a percentage of a staff member's gross salary.

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IMPORTANT! Under the law, no one can pay less that 1.5% of their salary for benefits, so in many cases, the "half" for the Garden State Health Plan for anyone who pays less that 3% under the NJ Educator's Plan would not really be half.

Is it worth it for me to switch over?

It is always difficult to answer questions like this as everyone's situation is unique. That said, the Garden State Plan is a MUCH smaller network, and only includes NJ Doctors. That means facilities like Sloan Kettering in New York would not be covered.

Garden State Health Plan FAQ's

NBOE will be offering a new medical plan option, the **Garden State Health Plan (GSHP)**, beginning July 1, 2022. To allow people to enroll in this new plan, NBOE will be offering a **Special Enrollment period from May 31st – June 6, 2022**.

This Special Passive Enrollment period for the GSHP is open to all benefit eligible NBOE employees whether you are currently enrolled in one of the District's medical plans or not. Also, note that the **GSHP** is only enrollment option during this special open enrollment period. For those who currently waive medical and/or prescription benefits, you can use this Special Passive Enrollment Period as an opportunity to enroll into the **GSHP** only. All enrollment changes will take effect on July 1, 2022.

Your benefits choices can have a big impact on your health care experiences and expenses, so it is important that you consider your options carefully and find the benefits that are right for you and your family. Here are a few highlights of the GSHP:

- The GSHP offers the same level of benefit for both in and out of network services as the NJ Educators Plan (NJEP)
- The co-pays mirror the rates for the NJEP
- The GSHP plan design follows the NJEP for both Medical and Prescription Drug benefits
- The GSHP uses the Aetna Whole HealthsM New Jersey network of providers.
- The GSHP offers a significantly smaller network in comparison to the other plans offered in the District
- This includes only 35% of Hospitals and 60% of the Physicians in the Open Choice network
- There is no coverage for out of state providers in the GSHP, except for of emergent care
- This includes facilities such as Memorial Sloan Kettering in NYC and CHOP in Philadelphia, which would now be considered out of network
