NTU LEGAL UPDATE: BE PRESENT WITH YOUR STUDENTS

Lack of supervision, lack of teacher presence where after a student is injured falls on the shoulders of the teacher who was not where they should have been. The consequences to the teacher are personally and professionally devastating. And rest assured, your administrator will hang you out to dry by saying "Why didn't you call the office? "Why didn't you call security?"



Awareness

Cover yourself. When a student runs out of your room call security and/or the office. Report it. If a student is too long in the bathroom, send a trusted student to find out what's going on. Be proactive especially with problem students. You know who they are. They will unhesitatingly make up a story about you.

Being personally sued is no fun. Being brought up on tenure charges or suspended is stressful. Don't leave your students alone except in bathroom situations and then be aware if a student is out of the class for an unusually long period. When on class trips, have pre-conferences with chaperones. While on the trip, constantly take head counts getting on and off a vehicle. When late, call your school so your students are covered.

When students are hurt, DYFS will first look to see what type of supervision was present and then place blame if they feel a lack of supervision existed and/or contributed to the injury.

All of the above-mentioned situations have caused serious problems to NTU members during the 2017-2018 school year. Be on your guard in 2018-2019.

You are risking lightening striking if you have bad supervisory habits which for years have not caused a problem and then all of a sudden lightening strikes.


