

3 ½ weeks to go...What should We be Doing

 Scheduling—Supt León recently advised Administrators to not create school schedules in a vacuum, but rather take advantage of and use the School Improvement Panel, Coaches, Building Reps, etc. in creating a schedule that will work given the school's physical and student size.

Past practice in this district has always been, and will remain, instructional staff are to be dismissed when students are dismissed. As with most everything, there are exceptions: Parent Teacher Conferences, Professional Development Days, etc. You may have to stay after 1:30 because of a Grade Level Meeting one day, while your peers get to leave and continue online when they get home. Safety is more important than anything else right now.

NTU sent out surveys to our Building Reps, Executive Board, and School Improvement Panel about how engaged they have been in the return to in-person instruction. These surveys showed us that we have a long way to go in terms of members and representatives engaging with their administration. Leaving staff

out of the process has resulted in situations like at Ann Street where some staff had been told to expect to move from room to room, which is a clear violation of district protocol.

This goes out to all administrators: at this week's Reopening Task Force, the Deputy Superintendent confirmed our above comments about staff and student dismissal. We will continue to work with the district to ensure this messaging gets out to all administrators and staff.

- Covid-19 Vaccines—Vaccination opportunities are now widely available, and you should be availing yourself of them. The board is requesting that you share your vaccination status with them, and there has been some push back on that. Why? As a professional courtesy wouldn't you want your employees to inform you that they're safe and pose little to no threat to you or your colleagues. It's a professional courtesy; there's nothing about you on the vaccination card that they don't already know.
- Student Covid Testing—Staff getting vaccinated is a great start, but just as important is having students Covid tested as well. Just like getting the vaccine cannot be made mandatory at this time neither can Covid testing for students. But that doesn't mean it's not a great idea. All Newark Covid testing sites test Newark children ages 6+ regularly. This factual and potentially lifesaving information should be shared with parents through Classroom Dojo, Remind, or whatever other means of communication you use.
- Facilities Check List—Use the general facilities checklist to guide you in returning to your school and classroom. Be mindful to "stay in your lane" and remember that Harriet Tubman is not the new South Street School. The needs of one does not necessarily translate to a need for the other. A teacher in a classroom 10ft away from her front row may not have or need a spit guard on her desk, you might. As of today, 75% of staff surveyed say they have not been involved in any school walkthroughs.
- Googling your Hybrid Doppelgänger—Somewhere out there is a teacher or support staff just like you, teaching the same subject in the same grade under the same Hybrid conditions as you will be teaching in 3 ½ weeks. Google her and, if she allows commenting, ask her some questions. We're teachers; we steal stuff from each other all the time.
