Last week, I described my experience visiting an elementary school in this district and how delightful it was to again see and hear learning and joy; to witness professionals treating each other

with trust and respect. Today, I remember a darker place.

The security guard's anxiety level rises as I approach the Security Desk and prepare to sign in before heading to the Main Office to announce myself to the principal. A *Code Red* must have gone off somewhere because I am immediately surrounded by 4 VP's, additional security, and the principal. "Why are you here?" "You mustn't interrupt instruction." "I have to check with Labor Relations before I allow you to enter." All this blah blah meant to intimidate me and dissuade me from my mission. I remain cool as a cucumber.

The lack of confidence and the fear in this bully is not really the saddest part of the experience. Their shadowing me is meant to discourage members from speaking to me, this I know. But, members have



a million ways of sharing their horror stories with me. The cowardice and bullying displayed by the administrator already confirms that what I am there to investigate is true.

There is silence in the school. The absence of laugher, excitement, the ooh's and aah's that come with learning. How can I be in a public school and not hear the sounds of children. Not a peep! Forget about respectful professional coexistence between administration and staff. Sadder than that still was the sight of a seated child simmering, masked at his desk in 99 degree heat, staring up out the window at the little tent of blue, which prisoners call the sky.

Personal Days Buy Back and Roll Over

Last Thursday, the district sent out the Personal Day Buy Back Forms. We have had a lot of questions about how personal days roll over or can be sold at the end of the

school year. If you are eligible and did not receive one, or have any questions, please email the Payroll Team at payrollcs@nps.k12.nj.us. The forms MUST be in by June 30, with payment expected on July 30.

To be eligible, you must have used 5 or less sick and personal days during the 2020-2021 school years. Note that all sick days (including those used for FMLA) count towards that limit. Also note that under NJ statute, staff can only roll over 15 additional days



each year, so if you have more than that, you should sell back your personal days or you will lose them!


