problem as seriously as we took COVID-19. We need a "Union of Forces" to come together to respond to this! If we continue on the current course, learning loss could become a generational problem with more lasting harm to our students than COVID!

We need a Learning Loss Taskforce that includes the District, Mayor's Office, EDUCATORS, and our community leaders!! One of the major problems with education

policy in this district has always been that the educators' voices are not clearly heard. Walk in any classroom in this district and you will find experts right there who can tell you why our students are falling behind and offering assistance to parents and families. Why aren't we listening to them?
