

# FOR PROFIT CHARTER SCHOOLS WANT NJ TAXPAYERS TO PAY FOR THEIR NEW BUILDINGS



Many NJ Public School Buildings are in need of upgrades and major repairs, whether due to general wear-and-tear over the years or from unforeseen situations like the COVID-19 pandemic. Meanwhile, corporate Charter Schools are looking to take the limited public funds set aside for Public Schools facilities in order to build and renovate their own for profit facilities.

Those much-needed improvements for our schools could be delayed or derailed in Trenton by Assembly Bill A4496. Under this amended bill, charter schools and renaissance school projects that are in New Jersey Schools Development Authority districts would be eligible for public funding covering all final eligible project costs.
