

From the Desk of the Secretary-Treasurer

When I first got hired by the Newark Board of Education, I believed the philosophy for how the board treated new hires was: Hire them, ignore them, if they survive the year, bring them back. Rinse, Repeat.

Twenty Six years later, and I feel that there has been very little shift in that philosophy. What's worse, is that there is less IGNORING a new teacher and more OVERLOADING/HARASSING.

Now the sole source of assistance comes from attempting to translate the rubric for new teachers. We ALL have experience with every administrator's favorite F-WORD...the FRAMEWORK...argued to be a tool of instruction and support, but we all know it's not. It's rarely used to assist new teachers, or veterans, it's used simply to score and move on.

When a teacher is given a poor rating, it can often be as much a grade of how well they understood the Framework as it might be an actual evaluation of their teaching. More than ever, a new teacher considers themselves LUCKY if they get an effective, but they can no more explain WHY they got it any more than could a teacher who got an ineffective explain why they got their rating.

This MUST change in this district. Admins have to stop considering themselves UMPIRES, using the Framework to simply call balls and strikes, and get back to COACHING. If every administrator HAD to keep every new hire for at least three years, I bet there would be a lot more coaching going on, and a lot less harassment. We have to approach the teacher crisis as a collective and act appropriately to retain new teachers, or we won't have any veterans, and THAT is a scary topic for another week.




