This year's recipients of the Princeton Prize for Distinguished Secondary School Teaching is Wahab Ashraf of Science Park High School in Newark, Wahab Ashraf teaches College Prep and Advanced Placement biology at Science Park High School, a magnet school for students in the Newark School District interested in pursuing STEM careers. Ashraf was named his school's Teacher of the Year in 2017–18 and 2021–22. He also teaches mathematics at Rutgers and New Jersey Institute of Technology, and he received the Rutgers University Presidential Award for Excellence in Teaching in 2022. Students enjoy Ashraf's classroom atmosphere, which they characterize as fun, engaging and hands-on. Many are inspired by his teaching to pursue further studies and careers related to biology.

THIS IS THE DANGER PERIOD FOR SCHOOL STAFF! THE STATISTICS PROVE IT!

Right now as I write you, there is a teacher before the New Jersey State Board of Education facing charges of child abuse and neglect. Their teacher licenses are at stake from a Board of Education seeking license suspension or worse revocation. Child abuse and neglect allegations really escalate between the months of May and June of every school year. This is the most dangerous period for staff. Classrooms become hot. Students fear bad grades. Overcrowded classrooms become somewhat more difficult. Failing students seek to aggravate staff into losing their temper. This Is not the time of year to be alone with problem students.

Talk to your colleagues and Building Rep about the inherent problems which can accrue at the year's end within your classrooms. Do not leave your class unsupervised! That's a recipe for disaster. Students have attacked classmates during the teacher's absence. Some have jumped out of classroom windows! I know all too well that you do not always get administrative support for the hard task you have.

Too often parental support is non-existent as well. So many people have no idea how difficult your job is. The NTU does! Let's get through the 2022-2023 school year unscathed! That's your goal!


